Literacy development is an important focus for the academy. The students having been working hard since the beginning of the school year to improve their literacy.

DEAR (Drop Everything and Read) Programme

Every day, after lunch the students along with their tutors read for fifteen minutes. This aids their fluency, comprehension skills and contribute to reading for enjoyment.

Vocabulary **Development**

Vocabulary development is built into the various subjects' curriculum. Each teacher is responsible for teaching the vocabulary specific to that subject. One of the techniques used is the look- say-cover- write technique. This does not only work to develop the vocabulary of our students but also helps in developing their cultural

Capital.

Fresh Start:

Students who are identified as needing special reading intervention are withdrawn for approximately 20 minutes per day and taught phonics and comprehension and other reading strategies.

As a new SEMH specialist provision in Gloucestershire, it's been a challenging but rewarding start to the new school year. This term we have really focussed on transitions and building positive relationships between staff and pupils – we are all a new team working together for the first time, after all!

We are fortunate to have Parallel Counselling and music therapy onsite to deliver interventions for pupils on a 1:1 basis. It has been amazing to see pupils taking ownership for their wellbeing and engaging so positively with Emmy and Matt.

We have developed our SEMH intervention offer, delivering sessions such as Banish Your Self-Esteem Thief, The Anxiety Gremlin, The Anger Gremlin, Lego Therapy, Talkabout for Teens, Resilience and Sensory Circuits. Pupils are allocated an intervention based on area of need and most of these run in smaller groups than the usual class of eight.
